The Pastor's Perspective

What To Pray For Now

Recent weeks have been difficult times for our Twin Cities community, full of conflict and anxiety. I hope you will continue to care well for one another: genuine friendship and supportive community are among St. Luke's greatest strengths! Come to worship when you can to refresh your spirit and connect with your church family, and please reach out to me if a pastoral visit or conversation would be helpful.

Also, be diligent in prayer. As Christians, we believe that prayer is powerful and draws our hearts closer to God's heart. You do not need to use words to pray, and God understands prayers that are nothing more than wordless sighs deep our spirits (Romans 8:26). But if you are wanting some words, I have offered suggested prayers below. Here are some specific issues I hope you'll be praying for right now:

1. The bishop election

In May 2026, the Saint Paul Area Synod will elect a new bishop. The election process takes months and is already underway. On February 14, nominations will begin at Conference Assemblies. Please be praying for the voting members of those assemblies (who are both lay people and clergy), and for the leaders they identify as potential candidates for bishop. As we move into the next stages of the election process this spring, continue praying for wisdom and clarity in the synod.

3. For strength and hope

You might just need some words to pray for strength and hope in these days – for yourself and for those around you. Hebrews 6:19 describes our hope in Christ as “a sure and steadfast anchor of the soul.” Your faith can be a source of grounding and confidence when all else feels shaky.

A prayer in times of distress:

Come to our help, merciful God. Our spirits are weighed down with fear; our bodies feel as fragile as the dust from which we came. Help us know you have not forgotten us. We do not trust in our own power or strength, but in your steadfast love in every generation. Show us your face in this time of trial, remind us of your faithfulness, and save us for the sake of Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Lent begins on February 18: Ash Wednesday. Join us on Feb. 18 at 6pm for an Ash Wednesday worship service with imposition of ashes. Every Wednesday during the season of Lent, (February 25, March 4, 11, 18, and 25) we'll have a simple soup supper beginning at 6 pm, followed by a Lenten service. You are invited to join us for 6pm service on both Maundy Thursday (April 2) and Good Friday (April 3). We will celebrate the resurrection with joy on Easter Sunday, April 5.

We'll begin the season of Lent halfway through February. Lent is often a time where people give something up or, in recent years, try something different. I thought I'd share something that I'm trying in 2026, in case it might be something you'd like to try for the season of Lent. One of my new daily practices is to read at least 10 verses of a Psalm with the option to use a hymn instead. As I was writing this, I checked and there are 41 hymns in the Lent and Holy Week section of the hymnal. For Lent, I'm in on both - I'll continue my Psalm practice but I'll sing/read a hymn as well and share a verse or phrase I found interesting on the music bulletin board throughout Lent. As a bonus, here is a verse to carry with you until then:

Psalm 36:9 "For with you is the well of life, and in your light we see light."



It's time for another KIVA meeting to lend out funds to individuals outside of the United States. We have a total of \$2,261.77 to lend out, with \$921.54 loans to be repaid to us.
