The Pastor's Perspective.

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ.

This month of June, we are celebrating the beginning of summer, virtual graduations, Flag Day, Children's Day and Father's Day. Busy month! On Father's Day, we honor all fathers, stepfathers, and adopted fathers. The Bible commands us to honor them; but this year, take some time to thank our heavenly Father for all he has done for us. God Almighty is our Heavenly Father, and He is the perfect example of what it means to be a dad. In the US, we celebrate Father's Day on the 3<sup>rd</sup> Sunday in June (June 20<sup>th</sup> this year). This celebration started back in 1910 when Sonora Smart Dodd was inspired by a Mother's Day sermon to begin a day in honor of fathers. Her father, Henry Jackson Smart, had raised her and her five siblings after her mother died in childbirth. Understandably, she wanted to honor her father. She had originally chosen her father's birthday, June 5<sup>th</sup>. But for logistical reasons, it was not celebrated until June 19th, 1910, in her hometown of Spokane, Washington. By the way, there is also a Children's Day (isn't every day children's day?) begun in 1856 for the 2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday in June (not officially celebrated in the U.S.). So celebrations for Children's Day (1856) came first, then Mother's Day (1908), and then Father's Day (1910). Let us all celebrate the families that God gives us and the love they share. Happy Father's Day!

Dear St. Luke members, please know there have been many hours of prayer, study, and thoughtful discussion during these pandemic times. Some are working on the Mission Site Profile document to help us search for a settled part-time pastor, the Safety Team has reviewed many sources for guidelines to safely return to in-person services, maintaining and cleaning our church for our return, and opening our church to all ministries to meet again. I am so pleased that the council members have been working hard to listen and follow God's leading. They strive to serve the congregation by putting aside their own interests to discern what is right and best spiritually, and follow God's true calling for this church.

We will return to our church home on June 13 at 9:30 am, and continue our simultaneous virtual service for those not able to attend in person. When we return, some things will be different. Some will attend in person, and some will continue to attend by Zoom. If you are unsure about being in a group setting, or are a caregiver, or are simply unable to leave your home, please continue to join the virtual service. If you are not feeling well or think you may have been exposed to someone with coronavirus, please stay home and worship with us via the virtual church. The in-person services will be a little different too. We will **not** be sharing the peace (not yet) or passing the offering plate for obvious reasons. Instead, the offering plate will be on the back table to give your offering before or after the service. We will still be able to give online or mail offerings to church. One of the realities that we must face is that singing is one of the most effective ways of spreading the virus. We will be wearing masks and we will not be singing the service or hymns. We will have instrumental hymns, led by our wonderful music director Rebecca Ruiz. I know how much you love music and how important it is to us to worship in song, but we don't want to sing and possibly cause someone else harm or death. So, until it is safe, we will forego singing and find other ways to praise God! The service may be different, but God will be glorified. As Christians, view this as another opportunity to invite others to this unique way to worship. Invite them to log on and join the virtual service or make a reservation through our dedicated administrator Jo Klein! Go forth and be Christ's witnesses in St. Luke and to the ends of the Earth.

We are learning, as we journey through these uncertain days, that the situation changes each week. However, after over a year of this pandemic, we can see the light at the end of the tunnel. So, I would ask everyone to live in God's grace a bit and realize we are all trying to do the right thing and keep everyone safe. We know these days will cease, and we will return to a church life where gatherings, hugs, dinners, and handshakes are the norm. Then we will joyously celebrate worship in person, but more importantly, celebrate our love and care for each other. Stay safe. If you have any needs, please call the church office, or forward your needs to one of our staff members. Let us remain strong, hopeful, and compassionate as we seek to continue building Christ's community of love and peace. As always, I am yours in Christ.

The Church Council and Safe Team have agreed we can return to in-house services on <u>Sunday</u>, <u>June 13</u>, <u>2021 at 9:30 a.m.</u> We will still broadcast on Zoom, as we have done for over a year.

The Safe Team would like you to be aware of the protocols in place to keep everyone safe.

- Make a reservation with Jo Klein, no later than noon the Saturday before worship.
- Wear a mask, and please no touching outside of family members.
- Enter through the front or parking lot doors.
- Use sanitizer when entering and exiting. There are three dispensers.
- Temps will be taken at the door you use to enter.
- Pews to be used will be marked on the aisle arms with blue tape.
- Please take a bulletin from the table and proceed to an available marked pew.
  - You may leave your offering in the plate on the back table or by the podium in front.
- Pew capacity: family of 4 on one end plus 1 on the other end; 2 people on each end; or 1 person on each end.
- Allow one pew at a time leave to avoid a crowd in the aisle and keeping six feet apart.
- There will be no Coffee Hour just yet (sorry).
- · Bathrooms will be open/available.

This is an exciting month! We are returning to our church home for services, and we will continue simultaneous Zoom services for those unable to join us in person. There will be guidelines for June that will not change: masks, social distancing, reservations. I hope that by July, we can revise the guidelines. We will also be able to take advantage of the warm weather to have outdoor services. We have a special congregation meeting coming soon to vote on the acceptance of the Ministry Site Profile (the form used by the Synod to share with possible candidates), and a Call Committee Ballot. We need at least 3 and would prefer 5 people to be on the Call Committee. That is an elected committee, so we now need volunteers. Please contact me if you are interested in helping to choose our settled part-time pastor.

We can't thank Pr. Belzer enough for all the extra time she has given us as an interim part-time pastor. I am sure every week our needs have exceeded 25 hours per week. While her generosity is so greatly appreciated, we must be far more realistic about a part-time pastor's schedule in the near future. Times have changed at St. Luke. We are a smaller congregation with fewer resources, and are now looking for a settled part-time pastor. Once the new pastor joins us, we must be realistic about time available. In addition to 25 hours as our pastor, the pastor is also required to attend Synod meetings and write reports above and beyond our time. A part-time pastor can be a full-time position with our expectations and Synod expectations. We must stay within the 25 hours per week for all visitations, sermon preparation, services (during the year there are many extra services for Lent and Christmas), confirmation, our missions, council meetings, office hours for meetings and counseling, etc. Of course, with growth, we could once again have a full-time pastor.

Now is the time to commit to each other and a new part-time pastor to share more of our time/talents to the needs and activities of St. Luke. There is absolutely nothing to stop St. Luke if we all give a little more in time, talent and tithes. Our building is doing well because of the continued maintenance. Realistically, however, we are not growing in numbers and are losing some of our larger contributors to relocation or death. We have so much to offer new members.

St. Luke members are welcoming, sincere, friendly, and most importantly, faithful children of God, always striving to find new ways to help or assist others. We can continue to grow if we step up now to being a more active member. We must support our settled part-time pastor with renewed energy and a willingness to try new ways to share our time and talents. All is possible with God's help. All is possible with St. Luke's energy and love for all people.

If you have driven by the church lately, you may have noticed the beautiful new parking lot. After many years of patching and repairing, it was decided it was time for a new paving job. With the use of our lot for the Farmer's Market, we were aware of the possibility of trips and falls as well.

Thanks to a generous donation bequeathed to St Luke by Eva Mac Niven, we were able to make it a reality this year. The cost of the project was approximately \$64,000 and was taken from our Vanguard account.
