# thrivent Financial

Thrivent Financial members of St. Luke, have you directed your Thrivent Choice \$ yet this year? If not, a wonderful way to support your church would be to direct those dollars to St. Luke. It is simple to do by logging into your account online or by calling your Thrivent agent. See instructions below.

### Online

- 1) Visit Thrivent.com/thriventchoice
- 2) In the Get Started section on the right, click **Direct Thrivent Choice Dollars**
- Log in by entering your user ID and password. (If you haven't yet registered on Thrivent.com, click Register for account access.
- 4) Choose the organization to which you want to direct Choice Dollars:
  - a. To direct to a previous organization:
    - i. Click **Direct Now** next to the organization's name, or
    - ii. Click on the View activity history link, scroll down and click on the name of the desired organization.
  - b. To direct to a new organization, enter keyword(s) like organization name, Zip code, cause, etc. Click Search
- 5) Choose **Direct All or enter a specific number** and click **Direct Now.** Follow the prompts on the confirmation page to direct Choice Dollars

#### By phone

- 1. Call **800-847-4830** and when prompted, say **Thrivent Choice.**
- Press 1 to direct Choice Dollars or 2 to hear Thrivent Choice Dollars Program Terms and Conditions. (If prompted, say or enter your phone number and date of birth.)
- 3. A representative will work with you to direct Choice Dollars.





We are going to begin a new chapter for St. Luke in January 2022. Pr. Reading will be experiencing her first year as an ordained pastor with us, just as Pr. Hock was a first-year pastor when he was welcomed to St. Luke. We are hoping that Pr. Reading will help us to grow our membership as she leads us in our faith. We must maintain our Vanguard Fund to keep our building open to our church family and others. I am hoping that those who are regularly making an offering will continue to do so, and perhaps increase when special projects are funded by our dwindling Vanguard Fund. We have been using the Vanguard Fund for monthly expenses not covered by offerings since March 2020. We used \$64,000 to repave the parking lot. This was a safety decision, and long overdue. If you are able to designate an extra amount to assist in replacing that large withdrawal, we will all benefit. It is so very important for our congregation to have the Vanguard Fund for replacements and repairs, but not for monthly expenses. Whether you have returned a stewardship pledge card or not, please be as faithful as possible in supporting St. Luke in this time of transition.

This will be my last President's Corner. I want to thank my congregation for your support these past two years. I am so proud that we have survived COVID, the separation from each other for over a year, the acceptance of Zoom services and Zoom meetings, the patience and guidance of Pr. Jacqueline Belzer since December 2020 as we regrouped, and having Bristol Reading accept our call as our three-quarter time settled pastor. I am thankful for being a member of this church family for 60 years. I have volunteered to organize the Zoom chats so Pr. Reading can meet everyone on a casual basis. Knowing us will certainly help her in discovering why St. Luke is important to each of us. Please be prepared to be available in January and February for a Zoom chat.

I know that our 2022 council will be fine leaders in working with our new pastor. Please support them so they can use their experience as council members and leaders to help us grow stronger.
