The Pastor's Perspective...

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ, I pray you are well.

Welcome to September. This month parents are getting ready to send children back to school. With the Delta variant of Covid-19 <u>infecting more children</u>, many parents are worried about keeping their unvaccinated young kids safe as schools reopen and extracurricular activities resume. I added personal prayers for children this school year, to my prayer list, with this thought in mind. I pray they will grow in their love of God and learn to trust Him more. Please pray that children will have opportunities to learn and be safe and well. Every instructor, teacher, professor, and peer will have good days and compassion for our children. To look for opportunities to be kind and loving with the same love Christ has so significantly given us. As this school year starts.
