The Pastor's Perspective

What is Lent?

Lent begins with Ash Wednesday on February 14. It is a six-week long season during which we prepare our hearts for Holy Week and Easter. You can use this time like a spiritual check-up, focusing on any areas of your faith life that need attention. That can look different for everyone. Many people use some form of fasting, or "giving something up," to provide spiritual focus. Other people choose to add a specific spiritual practice like prayer, meditation, or journaling as an method of intentional reflection.

In my experience, six weeks often sounds more doable than it feels. After a few weeks, it can feel hard to keep the focus you had at the beginning. So if you set an intentional practice for Lent, be gentle with yourself, and just keep coming back to it as often as you can.

Making a Lenten Garden

One simple practice we use in our home is the creation of Lenten garden. Start by filling a shallow bowl or plate with rocks or sand. You can add a cross or candle if you'd like. Then just leave it somewhere visible for most of Lent. Its starkness is a visual reminder of this penitential season. One option might be to add one rock per day for all 40 days of Lent. When Holy Week begins on Palm Sunday, I start to transform our garden by adding moss or leaves. Then on Easter morning, I add blooms and flowers (fake ones are just fine). You can see in the photos below I also replaced the cross with a homemade

paschal, or "Easter," candle, just like the big one we have in the sanctuary. These are easy to make with permanent markers and wax paper. We'll have a workshop at St. Luke toward the end of Lent if you'd like to make one for your home this year.

Wednesday Vespers at St. Luke

St. Luke has some special offerings during Lent that might bring meaning to this time for you. We'll gather for worship on Wednesday nights at 6 pm. The first service will be on February 14 for Ash Wednesday. Then Wednesdays February 21 through March 20 we'll offer Holden Evening Prayer, with soup supper available before the service. All Wednesdays will begin at 6 pm.

Lenten Art Cards

Another way you can participate in Lent is through making art cards. Use a standard 3.5 by 5 inch index card and any materials you'd like (markers, pencils, collaged materials, etc.) to make one or more art card each week, then bring them to share with others on Sunday morning. You can keep your own card or take another's home with you. Becca and I have created a series of themes for this year focused on the cross. Each week we have highlighted one verse of a hymn, one passage from scripture, and one focus prompt for your art cards. Below I've included an example for the first Sunday of Lent, so you can get a sense of that. Booklets with all six weeks are available in the sanctuary and on our website (click on "The Word & The Spirit Blog"). Becca will be posting videos of the hymns on our YouTube channel each week for you to listen to and reflect on.

Lenten Devotions

Lastly, I have written a series of devotions as I usually do for the weeks of Lent and Holy Week. These are also available printed in the sanctuary or downloadable on our website.

However you choose to focus on your faith life this Lent, I hope it is a season of growth for you. You are in my prayers always!

Easter Flower Fundraiser

With Easter right around the corner, it is time to think about decorating the sanctuary with flowers. This year we will be selling Easter lilies and other plants that can be used in our flower garden. Beginning Sunday, Feb 4th and running through Sunday, Feb 25th we will be taking orders for Easter flowers. Payment will be due at time of order, checks should be made out to St Luke Lutheran. Please visit the table in the social hall during coffee hour to see what is available and order your plants. Dates for pickup of plants still needs to be determined. If you would like to include them in the Easter garden, they can be taken home after worship that day.

Below is a sample of the hymn-themed art card prompt. You'll see that each week has a hymn verse, a scripture passage, and a short reflection to help you start thinking about what you might add to your art cards.

Lent 1, February 18: "Beneath the Cross of Jesus"

Beneath the cross of Jesus I long to take my stand; the shadow of a mighty rock within a weary land, a home within a wilderness, a rest upon the way, from the burning of the noontide heat and burdens of the day. ("Beneath the Cross of Jesus," verse 1)

Scripture Connection: Mark 1:12-13

¹²After his baptism, the Spirit immediately drove Jesus out into the wilderness. ¹³He was in the wilderness forty days, tempted by Satan; and he was with the wild beasts; and the angels waited on him.

Art Card Prompt

The Gospel for the first Sunday of Lent tells of Jesus' 40 days in the desert wilderness, during which he experiences hunger and isolation as he faces temptations from Satan. The first verse of "Beneath the Cross of Jesus" draws on similar imagery of a dry, hot wilderness. In the hymn, the shadow of the cross is a protective shelter and restful respite.

This is the irony of the cross: although it is a source of pain for Jesus, it is a source of salvation for us. The salvation we have through Christ's work on the cross brings us comfort and peace.

As you create your art card this week, reflect on wilderness times you have been through in your life. What does the wilderness look like? How might the cross of Christ bring relief during such times? How is the cross a protective rock? How is its shadow a shelter?


