
On <u>Sunday</u>, <u>April 12</u> we celebrate Easter and the resurrection of Jesus Christ our Savior and Lord. Our first service at 7 a.m. will be a bit different from the 9:30 am worship. During the 7 a.m. worship, we will begin by using part of the traditional (and very ancient) Easter Vigil service, also known as the Service of Light. Traditionally this service begins before the first light of dawn as it celebrates the risen light of Christ breaking into the world on Easter morning. We will begin this worship outside (weather permitting) around a fire in the east churchyard. The fire represents the first work of the Creator in the beginning: light. We remember that first creation, as well as the new creation that is found in Christ, the risen light of the world. We will light the paschal candle from that fire. The paschal candle is the large candle that represents the light of the risen Christ. Everyone will carry their own small candle, which they will light from the paschal candle. Then we will process into the sanctuary, the light of the paschal candle leading the way. This is the light of the risen Christ, but also symbolizes the pillar of fire that led the Hebrew people from Egyptian slavery to freedom. We remember that we are led from the slavery of sin to freedom in Christ. Once we arrive in the sanctuary, there will be four readings, which present a review of salvation history. The first is Genesis 1:1-2:4a which recounts the creation, now renewed by Jesus. The second in Exodus 14:10-13, 15:20-21, which tells of the deliverance at the Red Sea. The third is Isaiah 55:1-11, speaking of salvation freely offered to all. The final reading is Daniel 3:1-29, the deliverance from the fiery furnace, a kind of foreshadowing of the resurrection. From this point we will move to the Gospel, the sermon and Holy Communion as we complete the worship.

The second service at 9:30 will be a traditional Easter worship, like we have done in the past at St. Luke. Whichever worship you attend, come give thanks and praise to our gracious God who grants us new life and hope through his Son Jesus Christ our Savior and Lord!

Kit Kat Cookie Bar Recipe By: Joyce Bluel

Here is the recipe for the bars that I brought for coffee fellowship on March 8th that many people requested.

84 Ritz Crackers – (about 2 ½ sleeves)

1 ½ c. graham cracker crumbs

3/4 c. brown sugar

1 c. sugar

3/4 c. butter

1/3 c. milk

1 c. butterscotch chips

1 c. semisweet chocolate chips

3/4 c. peanut butter



Line a 9 X 13 inch pan with parchment or non-stick foil. Put a layer of Ritz crackers across the bottom.

In a saucepan, stir together graham crumbs, sugar, butter and milk. Turn heat to medium and bring to a boil. When mixture begins to boil, set timer for 5 minutes and boil for 5 minutes, stirring occasionally. Pour half of this mixture over the Ritz crackers, and then lay another blanket of Ritz over the graham cracker mixture. Pour remaining graham cracker mixture over second layer of Ritz, and then top with one last layer of Ritz.

In a saucepan, combine butterscotch chips, chocolate chips and peanut butter. Melt, over low heat. Spread melted mixture over top of last layer of Ritz.

Let this cool at room temperature for a while and then transfer it to the refrigerator for about half an hour or as long as it takes for chocolate/butterscotch/peanut butter layer to set. When it has set, remove from refrigerator by lifting it out by the parchment/foil. Place on cutting board and cut into bars.
