

Musings from the Music Director

Want to get rid of the "winter blues?" Consider singing or ringing at St. Luke!

The Chancel Choir rehearses from 7:00 - 8:00 pm every Wednesday and shares music during the worship services on the first and third Sundays of every month. The Bell Choir rehearses from 8:00 - 9:00 pm every Wednesday and shares music during the worship service on the fourth Sunday of every month. The Praise Band always rehearses from 7:00 - 8:30 pm on the 1st Wednesday of the month and leads the worship on the 2nd Sunday of the month (unless it is a special service).

Season Three - Wednesday, January 8th through Sunday, February 23rd.

Season Four - Wednesday, February 26th through Easter Sunday, April 20th

Season Five - Wednesday, April 23rd through Sunday, May 25th.

What role does music play in a worship service?

In my experience, music and worship are synonymous. As many of you know, I am a pastor's daughter. At the age of two, I sang my first solo, "Beautiful Savior" during a worship service. When my legs were long enough to reach the pedals, I played the organ for services. Twice a month, throughout my junior high and high school years, my father would lead service and I would play the piano for an afternoon worship service at the local nursing home. I am so grateful to my father for teaching me the important and significant role music plays in a worship service

It has always been my conviction that the music in a worship service is not or should ever be considered a **performance**; it is an integral part of the whole worship experience. The various hymns, anthems, and other music are used to enhance the various Biblical lessons, the Psalm, the sermon, and the overall iturgical Sunday theme. I spend a great amount of time and thoughtful reflection when selecting the hymns, anthems for the Chancel Choir and Bell Choir, the music for the Praise Band, the Prelude, Offertory, and Postlude music as well as all other worship music used during a service. I am committed to making sure that what is being musically shared on a particular Sunday morning is directly related to the overall worship "theme" of the day. It is my goal as the Director of Music to make sure that the music offered during any service enhances rather than distracts from the overall worship experience for the congregation.

In my opinion, the worship service begins when the Prelude begins and ends when the last note of the Postlude has been played! The Prelude music provides a time for personal, quiet preparation, reflection, and prayer. It is obvious that the members of St. Luke are a friendly bunch and enjoy talking with one another.

Once you walk into the sanctuary, I encourage all of you to prepare <u>silently</u> for the worship service. Listen to the prelude music and prepare your hearts and minds for the wonderful worship service to come! Also, please feel free to fully enjoy the Postlude music! I know that there will be plenty of "goodies" and coffee left if you decide to sit and listen to the Postlude - end of the worship service music!

I am so grateful to the volunteers who graciously participate in the Chancel Choir, Bell Choir, Praise Band, and any other vocalist or instrumentalist who shares his/her musical gifts during a worship service. The musical talents and offerings from everyone provides such a rich, musical dimension to the worship services at St. Luke Lutheran Church.

I am thrilled that there are many opportunities for all members at St. Luke, regardless of age or experience, to share their musical gifts during worship. I look forward to a wonderful year of providing worshipful and appropriate music for all of the services at St. Luke Lutheran Church.
