When we lived and worked in Japan, one of my assignments was to oversee the three-year short-term lay missionary program there. Most of the short-term lay missionaries were young people who were right out of college and were away, really far away from their family for the first time in their lives. While in Japan for those three years, they couldn't simply go home for the weekend or on a whim, or when they felt lonely.

These young missionaries arrived in Japan in September and often began suffering from culture shock, homesickness, missing friends, among other things. But it became especially difficult for them at Thanksgiving and Christmas. It was then that they realized, in a very deep way, all that their family, friends and home meant to them. Nahoko and I always invited them and others to our home for a Thanksgiving dinner, with turkey and all the trimmings. We often had 20 people in our home for that occasion. Being so far from home, one could see and experience a deep, deep thanksgiving for all of the people and things we often took for granted back home. But one thing we all realized is that our loving God traveled with us, providing us with new friends, as well as a new family of God. We found we were blessed, and so, gave thanks.

How has God blessed you? What would you miss if you were far from home and family for three years? What blessings would you see anew? Think and pray about that. Then join with your St. Luke family at our Thanksgiving worship on the evening of Wednesday, November 26 at 7 p.m. Come, give thanks to our loving God.

President's Blog November 2008

On November 2, 2008, at the semi-annual meeting, the congregation will be voting on elections to the 2009 council. One member of the Executive Committee, the Secretary, will be stepping down. Five commissioners will be leaving after two-year terms. I am asking each of you to consider running for a position on the church council. THERE ARE NO SPECIAL SKILLS NEEDED TO BE ON THE COUNCIL. Honest. To be on the Executive Committee, you must have previous experience as a commissioner on the council in past years. The position of **Secretary** is a key position. Currently, the Secretary handwrites the minutes during the meeting, and I have volunteered to type them out. I am willing to continue that system with our next Secretary. Hey, we'll provide the pencil and paper! Please consider running for Secretary. In fact, if you have previously been on the council, feel free to run for any position on the Executive Committee.

We will also be filling **5 empty commissioner positions** that will run from 2009 thru 2010. I've posted, at least twice, a proposal to decrease the number of commissioners on the council. While everyone may be in favor of that change to the Constitution, our bylaws require the change to be considered one more time (in May 2009) and then voted on in Nov. 2009. If it passes, the 2010 council will have fewer commissioners. However, this year, we are looking for 5 people to "step up" and fill the current openings. As a commissioner, you will be required to attend a meeting on the 2nd Monday of each month. Depending on the agenda, the meetings last from 1-2 hrs. (a very small portion of your evening every 30-31 days). Once you choose a commission to represent, it is entirely up to you how active you are on that commission. The ideal would be to provide opportunities for our congregation members to share talents and time. You would be seeking volunteers for those projects. Again, no special skills for commissioners; just a willingness to serve your congregation.

We need your help in letting us know you are willing to serve. It is vital to fill these positions so that we always have a quorum to make decisions. We want you to share ideas and visions you have for our congregation. Your opinions are important. Your time and talents are needed. Please consider running for Secretary or commissioner. Thank you!

And please vote on Tuesday, November 4 in the national elections! YOUR VOTE COUNTS!!!!!!!!
