We are in the midst of Lent, a time to remember your baptism as we move towards Easter and Christ's resurrection. This year we are joining with Immanuel and Pilgrim Lutheran churches for our Wednesday evening Lenten worships. Each Wednesday we will begin with a soup supper at 6:00 pm followed by the worship service at 7:00 pm. - 5. To serve all people following the example of Jesus? March 24 at Pilgrim Lutheran with Rep. Alice Hausman, MN State Rep. - 66B

News From The Council President - Nancy Hegdahl



It has taken me a couple months to mull this over, and I am finally ready to talk about it. In December, I received this package in the mail with this very nice silver pen and pencil set from Thrivent, and with the package came a letter that stated the following, "This month, the service of our 32,000 congregational coordinators comes to end. Thank you so much for your service and support of the Care in Congregations® program. We're grateful to members like you who truly make a difference in the lives of others."

First of all, I was shocked and unaware that this was happening. For many years now Thrivent has awarded our church \$1,600.00 by matching our fundraisers through the Care in Congregation program. Last year they decreased that amount to \$1,200.00 due in part to the economy. Second, I thought: why send these pen sets out to everyone? If they paid \$2.00 a pen set for 32,000 coordinators that would have been \$64,000.00, which could have been divided up nicely and distributed to the congregations! And last, I was disappointed that Thrivent ended this program, even if \$1,200 to \$1,600 doesn't seem like a huge amount to some of the bigger congregations around us, it helps St. Luke a great deal. It has helped to defray the cost of the February youth trip to Camp Onomia, and last year sent the youth on their Workcamp adventure. I wasn't ready to let this go, so I contacted the South Ramsey County Chapter President, and expressed my concern regarding the ending of this program. I found out that he shared my disappointment and encouraged me to talk to our Thrivent congregational representative. Since then I have found out that they will be rolling out a new program this summer called the Thrivent Choice Program. Details are still a little sketchy but they will begin enrolling congregations sometime this month. The Choice Program allows its members to help direct Choice Dollars to thousands of Lutheran nonprofit organizations, including Lutheran congregations. All congregations will need to be enrolled and organizations in our area will need to have approval from the South Ramsey County Chapter to be eligible to receive funds from Choice Dollars. Needless to say, it will be interesting to see how all this unfolds! You will notice that the youth spaghetti dinner did have sponsorship from the Thrivent South Ramsey County Chapter up to \$800. So please support the youth so that they can reach their matching dollars!

Council Members: There will be no council meeting on Monday, March 8. Instead the council will be retreating on March 20; watch for further details.

Results of the 2009 Fall Bazaar by Joyce Bluel

The Bazaar committee met on January 31st after worship to discuss the results of the 2009 Fall Bazaar. Gross sales were \$6,413.21 and after expenses the net proceeds were \$4,517.71.

The committee voted to send \$100 to the Airport ministry \$1,000 to Camp Onomia, \$300 to the Youth Work Camp Spaghetti Dinner to purchase a flat screen TV for its silent auction, and \$500 to sponsor the youth work camp leaving \$2,617.71 to be added to previous years balances totaling \$13,461.17 in the bank. Other decisions were made to purchase new stackable chairs for the social hall to replace our old folding chairs, having a cushion made for the long pew in the social hall and having the carpet in the social hall professionally cleaned. These last three items will need to be priced out and deducted from our balance.

Among some of the other items that were discussed to be funded with these proceeds were repairing our existing stove or purchasing a new one for the kitchen (this may involve installing a ventilation system), and resurfacing and restriping of the parking lot (this could be more costly than the Bazaar could fully fund). It was decided that these two items should be sent to the Property Commission of the Church Council to be further researched and discussed.
