Support Our Schools

A Community Partnership Opportunity for St. Luke

St. Luke has been contacted by Support Our Schools, a non-profit organization committed to improving the academic achievement of students in St. Paul Public Schools. One way that it does this is through a program called "Leadership United", which connects schools with community partners. Currently, they are working with the St. Paul Area Council of Churches to connect individual schools with members of the faith community.

St. Luke has the opportunity to become partners with Homecroft elementary school, which is just across Edgcumbe road from the church. Many of you have a long history with Homecroft. Some of you may know that Homecroft's future is uncertain. This uncertainty should not prevent us, however, from considering partnering with the school between now and the end of the school year. Enrolling just under 300 students, Homecroft is a small school. Most of the students do not speak English at home and receive free or reduced lunches at school. These are kids who are working hard to learn a language, acquire reading and math skills and often eat their best meal of the day at school. This is an opportunity for St. Luke to be a good neighbor to some of the neediest members of our community.

As a Homecroft volunteer, you could volunteer an hour a month, a week or much more. All ages are needed and welcome. Would you be willing to do any of the following?

- --help in the library
- --tutor in reading, writing and math
- --help to plant and maintain a school garden
- --greet students in the morning (8:40 to 9:10 a.m.)
- --help students during breakfast (8:45 to 9:10 a.m.)
- --chaperone on field trips



INTRODUCING PASTOR DAVID R. PERSON!



Pastor Dave is originally from St. Peter, MN. He graduated from Gustavus in 1975, Luther Seminary in 1983 and was ordained on June 5, 1983. Pastor Dave has been married to Nahoko for 29 years. They met in Japan when he was a lay missionary for the Japanese Evangelical Lutheran Church (JELC) from 1975-1978. Nahoko Person returned to college while they were in Zimmerman, MN. She studied at the College of St. Benedict (St. Cloud, MN) and received her BSN degree in nursing graduating cum laude. She is currently a nurse at North Memorial Hospital working evenings and every other weekend. They have 2 adult sons, John and Andy. John is 28 and in the midst of his doctoral program at the University of Chicago in the Department of Eastern Languages and Civilizations. Andy is 24 and currently works at a Japanese restaurant. He hopes to become a writer. The other member of the family is Shima,

their cat (and queen of the household!).

Pastor Dave's most recent work experience was with the JELC as an Overseas Secretary/Pastor/
Youth worker. That lasted from 2000 to 2007. He has worked with the JELC previously from 1975 to 1992 (with a break in there for seminary). All this experience with the JELC has given him the ability to translate Japanese, and he can speak Japanese. From 1992 to 2000, Pastor Dave was the Pastor at St. John Lutheran Church in Zimmerman, MN.

The Call Committee and the Council support the calling of Pastor Dave Person based on the information presented in his call papers and two interviews with the Call Committee. He is a warm and engaging person. He brings with him the full experience as a pastor by preaching, offering the sacraments, weddings, baptisms, confirmation instruction, funerals, and visiting the sick and home-based to serve communion and offer prayer. His missionary work in Japan involved work camp experiences with adults and youth. An example was being a leader of a group of adults and youth from Japan to India to assemble artificial legs. There are work camp experiences available in the U.S. He is also familiar with camping in the Boundary Waters. He has exciting and new ideas to address our concerns with finding and welcoming new members, our stewardship needs and financial goals, and continuing programs for our youth after confirmation. When the Call Committee requested references, we were pleased and assured that Pastor Dave was the right candidate for us. His references provided us profiles of Pastor Dave that were filled with their admiration and confidence in his skills as a pastor and as a member of their congregations.

The Call Committee and the Church Council highly recommend the congregation to approve our motion to call Pastor David Person as the next pastor to St. Luke Lutheran Church.
